kanopy

THOUGHTFUL ENTERTAINMENT



Kanopy is a video streaming service now available to all ROOSEVELT PUBLIC LIBRARY cardholders. Kanopy offers a wide variety of movies, documentaries, foreign films, classics, children's content and more.

How does it work? Tickets are used to play videos on Kanopy. Each month, you receive a set number of tickets from your library. Your tickets reset on the first day of the month, and unused tickets don't roll over to the next month.

The children's content – Kanopy Kids – is a little different. Once you watch your first Kanopy Kids video, you have access to the entire children's selection for the rest of the month without having to use your credits.




