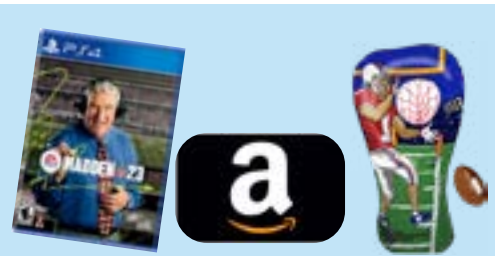

 - Submit a book a review in person or email it to youthserviceslibrarian@roosevttlibrary.org
 - Book review must be on a YA book
 - Must be at least 250 words, no longer than 400 words
 - Give enough detail to make the person reading your review want to grab the book and read it as well
 - Make sure when you submit you give your full name, grade, school that you attend, Author and Title of the book, and a rating of the book (scale from 1 to 10, 1 being the worst, 10 being the best)
 - Most importantly, make sure it is an original review!
 - You will be able to do this two times a month for a total of 4 hours per month!

General Library Card Information

The Library card number is the patron's permanent number. Patrons must report a lost or stolen card immediately. A duplicate card will be issued for \$5.00.

Roosevelt Public Library cards are valid for (3) three years after being issued.

Cardholders are responsible for all materials charged out to their card. They are required to pay for any damage or loss of library materials charged to them.

Library cards are not issued 30 minutes prior to closing.

Renew Library a Card

Library cards are renewed once every three years. To renew a library card, all patrons must again show that they have:

- Proof of residence in Roosevelt
- No outstanding late fees or other debts on their card

If a patron moves out of the Roosevelt Public Library district, their library card becomes invalid.

Adults

To obtain a Roosevelt Public Library card, adults must present one (1) item of proof of residence in Roosevelt.

Examples of proof of residence include:

- letter with the current month's postmark addressed to the registrant's home address. (Post Office boxes are not acceptable)
- recent bill with registrant's name on it
- valid New York State driver's license or a non-driver's ID issued by the NYS Department of Motor Vehicles

Young Adults-(7th to 12th Grade)

To obtain a Roosevelt Public Library card, Young Adults need to present proof of identity and one (1) proof of residence, and proof they are in the 7th grade or higher. If proof of identity verifies age (12 years old), no proof of grade is required.

Examples of proof grade level include:

- recent report card and proof of residence
- a dated letter from school verifying registrant's name, address and grade
- school library card
- official class schedule for the current year
- official school picture I.D. card for current year

Juvenile (Kindergarten to sixth grade)

To obtain a Roosevelt Public Library card, children must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian who must bring with them:

- the child's birth certificate (with seal), school report card or Medical insurance card
- one (1) item of proof of residence for parent or legal guardian, who must prove guardianship
- The child must be able to fill out the front of the library application
- Pre-kindergarten children who are able to write their own name will be issued a library card.

Información general para la tarjeta de la biblioteca

La tarjeta de la biblioteca es el número permanente del cliente. Si la tarjeta se pierde o es robada el cliente debe reportarlo. Una tarjeta nueva será emitida por \$5.00.

Las tarjetas duran tres (3) años. El cliente es responsable por los materiales prestados. Si los materiales están en malas condiciones o a perdido el material, tiene que pagar el cargo total del material.

Las tarjetas no son emitadas 30 minutos antes de cerrar.

Renovar una tarjeta

Las tarjetas expiran después de tres años. Para renovar una tarjeta,

- el cliente debe presentar una prueba de dirección reciente y una identificación.
- debe tener su tarjeta libre de cargos. Si el cliente se muda del distrito, la tarjeta deja de ser valida. Las tarjetas se renuevan cada tres años.

Tarjetas para Adultos

Para obtener una tarjeta de la biblioteca de Roosevelt, los adultos deben presentar

- una carta con la dirección y sello del mes reciente. (No incluye cajas de la oficina del correo)
- una prueba de dirección reciente y una identificación. La prueba puede ser un bill al nombre de la persona que desea obtener la tarjeta.
- También pueden presentar la licencia de conducir o una identificación emitada por el Estado de Nueva York.

Jovenes Adultos (septimo a grado superior)

Para obtener la tarjeta de la biblioteca de Roosevelt, los jovenes

- deben presentar identificación y una prueba de residencia reciente.
- ejemplos de prueba pueden ser una identificación de la escuela, el horario de clase, una carta de la escuela con el nombre del estudiante o un identificación del Estado de Nueva York.

Juvenil (Kindergarten a sexto grado)

Para obtener una tarjeta de la biblioteca de Roosevelt, los niños

- deben presentarse con sus padres o guardián.
- El padre o guardián debe presentar el certificado de nacimiento o la tarjeta de seguro medico del niño.
- El padre o guardián también debe presentar su identificación y una prueba de dirección reciente. El niño debe saber escribir para llenar la aplicación.
