THE EQUALIZER 3, 2023 [DVD] BH EQUALIZER

In this sequel, part of the Equalizer series, the former government assassin, Robert McCall, played by Denzel Washington, finds him, taking on the local mafia, to protect his Italian friends.

THE HOLDOVERS, 2024 [DVD] HOLDOVERS

The Holdovers, set in a New England prep school, is the story of the unlikely bonding over the winter break, of an experienced teacher, the grieving Afro-American head cook, and an unruly troublemaker.
